He ran out of the house, and Finn and Una never saw him again.



In nearly every part of the world, people tell stories about giants. In some stories the giants are just very tall men. In other stories the giants are bigger than the highest mountain. But these are all stories. Let's look at some real giants.

The tallest man living today is Haji Mohammad Alam Channa. He was born in 1956, in Pakistan. The tallest woman is Sandy Allen, who was born in 1955 and who lives in the USA. They are both 2 metres 33 centimetres tall.

The tallest man of all time was an American called Robert Wadlow. He was born in 1918 and he was 2 metres 72 centimetres tall. His hands were 32 centimetres long. (This book is 23 centimetres from top to bottom!)

When he went into hospital, he slept on two beds tied together. When he wanted to turn over in bed, he needed thirteen people to help him.

#### **Giant animals**

The biggest animal in the world does not live on land at all - it lives in the sea. It is the blue whale. Some blue whales are more than 30 metres long. These whales are as heavy as 35 elephants, or 2000 people.

Blue whales make singing noises to each other. These whale 'songs' can travel hundreds of kilometres through the water to other blue whales. A whale song is the loudest sound in the world from a living animal.



The biggest animal on land is the African elephant. Often these elephants are more than three metres tall and weigh more than 5000 kilos. The tallest animal on land is the giraffe. From its feet to the top of its head it can grow

as high as six metres!





### Funfair facts

Everyone loves the fun of the fair. There are lots of different things to do. You can test your strength with the big hammer, you can eat ice cream or candy floss, and you can go on roundabouts, swings, bumper cars, or other exciting rides.



All over the world there are fairgrounds and amusement parks. Many cities in the world have fairgrounds which are open all year round. In some countries, smaller travelling fairs visit a town or a village. The fair stays for a week or a few days. When it is finished, the fairground workers pack everything very carefully into lorries and move on to the next place. Then they put their rides and stalls up and start all over again. They look after the machines that drive the rides. They live and travel with the fair.



About a hundred years ago most fairground rides were driven by steam engines. You can still find some of these 'steam fairs' today, as the picture above shows. But in modern fairgrounds, the rides use electricity. On the next pages you can read about some of these rides.

## Great fairground rides

The Corkscrew ride is on the Gold Coast in Australia. You can see the loops of the 'corkscrew' in the picture.

When you go round a loop in a roller coaster, you don't fall out of the car when it is upside down. Why is this?

Because the car is moving fast and in a circle, your body is pressed into the seat of the car, and away from the centre of the loop. Of course, you wear a safety harness as well.

The loops on this ride turn riders upside down three times, at speeds of 100 kilometres an hour!



The High Roller is the world's highest roller coaster. It is in Las Vegas, in the USA. The ride runs 300 metres above the ground, around a huge tower, called the Stratosphere. The cars carry you round the top of the Stratosphere three times.

If you keep your eyes open, you can see the city of Las Vegas below you, as the next picture shows.



The other Stratosphere ride, the Big Shot, sends its riders up the tower in two seconds. These two rides use enough electricity to supply a small town!
